

Proposition 6 – Examples For Exhibitors by Mary Kolencik

Consider a class of seal point Siamese males with two opens and just two rings in the show:

The two cats split the winners' ribbons. In the new show season, here is what your catalog will look like for the same results:

In Judge AA's ring, cat number 100 gets the purple ribbon and "banks" one grand point. In Judge BB's ring, 101 gets the purple ribbon and "banks" one grand point. Both cats will be able to use both rings as Qualifying Rings for the champion claim.

Here is what Judge AA's sheet will show (Judge BB's sheet will have the awards reversed):

Okay, let's look at something a little more complicated, a class with four cats, one of which is a champion, and six rings. Here is a catalog section from the current system:

That's a pretty sucky day for the owners of those three seal point male opens. All of them will be going to a second show, and possibly more if they all three keep running into each other. Now let's look at the same cats under proposition 6:

Note that the bottom two cats are reversed from the prior catalog piece. This is because Sibercats Point Seven is older than Sibercats I'm-Not-A-Siberian. With four cats competing as champions in the class, the purple ribbon is worth three grand points. In this scenario, 100 earns six Qualifying Rings and "banks" six grand points from two purple ribbons. 101 earns six Qualifying Rings and "banks" six grand points. 102 earns three grand points. 103 earns six Qualifying Rings and "banks" three grand points. All three opens in the class, 100, 101, and 103, can now clam the champion title.

I'll go through one more example, this time with grands, withholds, and multiple color classes.

There are eight opens and three champions making the total number of champions in breed 11, and the purple ribbon worth 10 grand points. Let's assume the rings occur in order from left to right. There were three cats absent from the same two rings, all owned by the same person, so that person was probably late to the show. One of the cats was an open, and with today's system, missing two rings out of six with an open is painful. But now, the owner of the MH cats would still have had a productive show since each of the three cats earned grand points in breed, and possibly in finals. Hey, if you have an open, you can be late to a show and not spoil the whole day!

In this example, there are four cats that are from the same litter, the four Maryk cats, #100, 101, 107, and 108. Under today's rules, the owner would most likely split those up and only enter two to avoid splitting winners ribbons. But this looks like a very productive show for those four cats. 100, 101, and 108 each earned six Qualifying Rings and the owner can now make the champion claims on all three. In addition, 101 banked 20 grand points from just purple ribbons. 107 received a WC (wrong color) from Judge EE, perhaps because the lilac point looked too much like a blue point to

that judge. This would have been cause for much complaining under the winners ribbons system. Now, even with that WC, it was still a productive show for 107 with five qualifying rings and at least 10 grand points in the bank.

Here's the breakdown of what each of the opens earns and banks:
